You will monitor, troubleshoot, and optimize production processes to meet daily targets while ensuring full compliance with safety, environmental, and operational standards.

This is a camp-based position on a 2 weeks on / 2 weeks off rotation, working in a remote environment. The role supports approximately 60 sweet wells accessible only by helicopter 9 months of the year and 14 sour wells associated with a compressor station and facility that are shut in most of the year. This position offers a unique opportunity to work in a challenging and dynamic field setting while contributing to the reliable and safe performance of our operations.

Key responsibilities

Operations & monitoring

- Operate, inspect, and maintain field production equipment including wellheads, separators, compressors, pumps, and storage tanks.
- Monitor daily production volumes, pressures, and flow rates to identify abnormalities or potential issues.

- Perform start-up and shutdown procedures for field equipment as required.
- Adjust valves, controls, and equipment settings to maintain optimal production levels.

Maintenance & troubleshooting

- Conduct routine field inspections and preventive maintenance tasks.
- Identify, report, and assist in repairing mechanical, electrical, or process issues.
- Collaborate with maintenance and engineering teams to address downtime or optimization opportunities.
